Bluebells

They loved rolling the tyre through the paint to see what colours it made.

The Bluebells have begun looking at some life cycles of animals and spring activities. The children enjoyed looking at The Hungry Caterpillar story and helping put it back into the correct sequence. They have been using their fine motor skills to transfer the bees from one area to another using the tweezers. They have been looking at different flowers and making some beautiful spring pictures using natural resources that we have collected on our walks.

As we approach warmer weathers we will start to look at growth and begin to grow some plants and vegetables with the children too. Please do let us know if you are growing anything at home too! We are also on the look out for tadpoles for the children to observe the life cycle in the room.

For Earth day we made pictures of butterflies and looked for nature on our walks. We spoke about the world we live in!



Daisies

This month the Daisies room have been able to explore our outdoor environment's a lot more, whilst also getting creative whilst out and about.

The older children are getting so good at using our walking line when walking to the field. They all hold on to the line and follow the practitioners as we take a slow, steady walk to the field across from us. In the field we have explored arts and crafts: such as creating our own earth using grass and sticking this onto paper. This was for earth day. We have also changed our obstacle course around so it has a different course each time we visit. The children have enjoyed chasing the bubbles in the wind to pop them and also finding some of them landing in the grass. We have been lucky enough to watch the digger and tractor too whilst they have created the new car park. The children loved seeing them in action, moving the mud around and tipping it into the back of the tractor's truck. Whilst out we have also spotted lots of different birds and even heard the bird of prey (red kite) calling as it swopped down to get its prey in the big end of the field.

A big favourite in Daisies this month has been body painting. The children have used their hands, feet and different tools to create their own masterpieces. For national heritage day, the children used their hands to create the different flags for the countries that our families at monkey puzzle are from. We then added them to a tree for our room family tree.

We are looking forward to all the celebrations in May, more time outside and our room stay and play!

Tulips






